Washington, D. C. - 2330 EDT 27 July 52

(as telephoned to OIN-2A2 on 28 July 52)

1. A bright yellow cluster-like "nebulae", intense "light", elliptical shaped - about 10 in number - stationary then moving northward in pulsating manner -  $45^{\circ}$  from Horizon.

2. 2330 EDT, 27 July 52. Observed for two minutes.

3. Visual with naked eye from ground.

4. At home in Spring Valley, Md. (address below). Observer faced about due West - range of vision  $30^{\circ}$  -  $80^{\circ}$  above Horizon - no planes in area.

5. Mr Sharp, researcher, Civil engineer, reliability unknown, 4619 Sedgewick Street, N.W., Spring Valley, Maryland; phone at work: Code 1215, X-2093. Other observers: (neighbor's wife) Milton Talbert, 4612 Sedgewick Street; who said object was going N.E.; Mrs Sharp.

Washington, D. C. - 2100 EDT 27 July 52

(As telephone to CIN-2A2 on 28 July 1952)

1. Round object large, casting sun's reflections. Wavered then shot straight up-disappearing from sight. Seen in assumed N.E. direction.
2. 2100 EDT, 27 July 52, observed for one minute.
3. Visual with naked eye from ground.
4. Observers at Washington National Airport. Object seemed to hover over the Capitol Building in Washington, D. C.
5. Sgt. Thomas Froelich, Miss Barbara Walsh, and friend-assigned to Documents and Dissemination Branch, D/I, Hq USAF, X-52563. Reliability unknown.

Washington, D. C. - 1830 EDT 27 July 52

(As telephoned to OIN-2A2 on 28 July 52)

1. Circular - like object, "very high," trail of smoke behind with small halo around it. Airplane seen "chasing it" (?). Seemed to make two circles around Washington, D. C., soon disappeared "counter-clock" northwards. Object seemed "opalescent".
2. 1830 EDT 27 July 52. Observed for two minutes in clear vision.
3. Visual with naked eye from ground (bldg).
4. Observer at home, on top of apartment house, Washington, D. C. Object disappeared northward.
5. Miss Ruth M. Lunn, 1625 Connecticut Avenue, N.W. (DU-2116). Employee for American Institute for Research, Washington, D. C. Also observed by one other person, a neighbor. Reliability unknown.

Washington, D. C. - 2200 EDT 27 July 52

(As telephoned to OIN-2A2 on 28 July 52)

1. Two pin-point, star-like objects, one green, one orange, travelling "very slowly" and surging, with "red flashes" emanating from them going in assumed Westerly direction.
2. 2200 EDT - 27 July 52 - Observed for two hours.
3. Visual with naked eye from ground.
4. Observers at home in N.W. Washington, D. C. Green object first seen by observers then orange object reported to them by neighbor. Objects directly overhead - very high - moving westerly.
5. Mrs Betts, SLigo 5191, other observers: Mr Betts and neighbor, reliability unknown.

Brightwood, Maryland - 2340 EDT 27 July 52

(As telephoned to OIN-2A2 on 28 July 1952)

1. Cylinder-shaped, "1/2 - 3/4 size of a/c" yellowish - red at one end, shell-like whistle heard sparks seen. Heading eastward (sketch enclosed).
2. 2340 EDT, 27 July 52. Observed very briefly.
3. Visual with naked eye from ground.
4. Observer at home (had been asleep) Brightwood, Md. Object disappeared eastward.
5. Mr Ben Murow, employee of Agriculture Department, reliability unknown.
